A report on Celebration of National Endangered Species Day at IFB, Hyderabad.

The Institute of Forest Biodiversity, Hyderabad organized a program on the occasion of National Endangered Species Day for the week from 14-May 2022 to 20-May 2022 under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav on 20.05.2022. Shri E. Venkat Reddy, IFS, Head Extension explained the objective of this program and he also explained the importance of protection & conservation of endangered species, etc. A total of 18 Officers/ Scientists and Technical staff participated in this program.

Dr. P. Anjaneyulu, Field Assistant, FRCCE, Vishkapatanam the speaker introduced the topic and importance of the National Endangered Species Day, the protection & conservation of endangered species in eastern Ghats. He explained the history of the Eastern Ghats, Climatic conditions, IUCN-RED data book, species list, classifications, endangered analysis, and endangered species in eastern Ghats including Pimpinella hamiltonii, Cycas Shorea tirupatiensis, Decalepis beddomei, Cycas circinalis. Eriocaulon richardianum, Syzygium tumbuggaia, **Pterocarpus** santalinus, alternifolium, Prunus ceylanica & Wendlandia angustifolia species availability, and its medicinal properties, etc. The overall program is coordinated by Shri E. Manikanta Reddy, Technician & Shri Varun Singh, Technician, Extension Division.
